The Courage of God

I've been thinking about courage. Perhaps it was because Memorial Day was coming up. I wonder what enables someone to run into danger, to go towards trouble. What must they tell themselves? How does one steel body and mind to fight the impulse to flee, the better judgement of waiting on someone else, or thinking it was someone else's problem. I've never been good at physical bravery. I tend to move to flight rather than flight and wondering what third options God might give us.

I have read and often thought that courage is not about not being afraid. It's about being afraid and still being willing. To not be afraid, in some cases, means to not have good sense. Scripture never tells us that there are not reasons to be afraid. It just says, again and again, "Fear not." "Perfect love casts out all fear."

When I think of courage, I think most often of police officers, fire fighters, soldiers, who put their lives on the line every day for the sake of others. But, I know that there are other reasons to be afraid besides war and violence and catastrophes. There is loneliness, sickness, loss, major life changes, heartbreak and on and on. When I think of those things, it puts courage in another light. Having taken care of someone with dementia, I know a bit of the frustration, the exasperation, and the sadness of losing what you knew of someone all too soon. After my mother died, it occurred to me that for all that she had lost, what she had gained was an amazing courage. Imagine bravely going through life when everything has changed. Things don't look the same, people don't act the same, you don't remember things, and yet, you carry on.

It is the same with grief and illness. Something is lost. Things are different, will never be the same, and yet, somehow, we carry on. I think about our neighbors who live on the streets. Rarely getting a kind word, not knowing where their next meal will come from, not knowing where they will sleep or if they will be safe. And yet, they keep at it. They have a will to live and love and participate in this crazy life.

Joshua 1:9 says, "Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified. Do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." The Spirit of the Lord will guide us and be with us whatever the danger we face, whatever we fear. We will not be alone.

Let us face each day with confidence remembering this powerful Presence. Let us treat each other gently, remembering that we do not know what others are going through. Let us be grateful. Let us be kind. Let us be filled with the courage of God to be God's people in this world.

... from your Lay Leader


There are many things I could write about this month—the upcoming Annual Conference meeting in Huntsville, my in-the-works discipleship group starting in July, the next Bell Tower Players production, etc. But for a couple of months I have been thinking about the creed that we say most Sundays, from the United Church of Canada. I've especially been thinking about the part that begins, "We are called to be the church . . . ," and I wanted to explore what follows. This month, I invite you to think with me about what it means "to celebrate God's presence." We often think about Communion as the main way we do this, but does that mean we only celebrate the Presence once a month? I doubt it. How do you do it? In prayer, in sharing ways God has made God's self evident in your life? In starting each day with words of thanks for all the gifts God has given to you, all the blessings God has showered on you, your family, your loved ones? Reading Psalms or other scripture passages that celebrate God—like Psalms 7, 34, 89, 92, 95, 100, 106:1-3, 107:1-3, 111, 136, 138—there are a lot of choices! What about singing your favorite hymns? "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms" ("What a fellowship, what a joy divine!"), or "There's Withing My Heart a Melody" ("Jesus, Jesus, Jesus—sweetest name I know. Fills my every longing, keeps me singing as I go"), "How Great Thou Art" ("Then sings my soul, my Savior God, to Thee") or again, any of your favorites or any of hundreds of others that celebrate God's presence.

You probably have other ways that you celebrate—not simply acknowledge—God's presence in your life. I invite you to share them with me if you will, so I can pass them on to others in our congregation. Next month, we'll look at how we "live with respect in Creation." Meanwhile, I am

Sundays 10-11am | July 2-mid Aug. | 1st Floor Meeting Room


