How God Sees It

It has become my practice to get up early each morning and settle in to a cup of coffee or two, cuddles with the cats, and what is often, my only quiet time of the day. I have started getting up a little earlier each morning to make the most of that time. Many of you have a similar practice of morning prayers, morning devotionals, getting your day off to the right start. I use this time to pray through my joys and the things that weigh on my heart. I send texts to people that I know are struggling or have a particularly tough or important day ahead. I read a variety of devotional texts and the scriptures that they are based on. I know that prayer works. I don't know how it works. But, I am pretty sure I know how it doesn't work. I don't think it is dependent on us being faithful enough or saying the right thing because we never are, and never will, and it would be a losing battle from the start. I don't believe it's like a wish list for Santa and if we are good, it will be granted. If that were true, you and I know many things that would have happened differently due to all the faithful people praying.

I believe God waits for us. Not waiting with arms crossed, tapping a foot and sighing, waiting until we get the answer right. But God longs for connection with us. God paces the floor like a worried parent, scans the horizon for the lost child to come home. Hopes that we will plop down on the spiritual sofa and pour out our hearts. God waits for our eyes to widen to the beauty, our ears to open to the drumbeat of justice, and our hands to reach out to grasp another's. God waits for us. God longs for us. We lean into the Presence through the act of our prayers.

When I lift the name of someone to God, I can see them in the presence of God. When I give thanks for the butterflies in my garden or the blue sky or a new friend, my awareness of beauty increases. When I cry out for help or hope, my mind and heart open a little more to the presence of the Holy Spirit and her comfort and calling. Prayer changes things. Prayer changes me. The more I pray, the more I stand in the presence of God. The more I pray the more I catch glimpses of the reality of the Kingdom of God. The more I pray, the more and more I see the way God longs for this world and me to be.

Prayer strengthens our relationship with God. Prayer opens our eyes and our ears and our hearts. Prayer brings the Kingdom nearer because we have eyes to see it. Prayer gives us glimpses of how God sees us and how God hopes things will be. Let us pray without ceasing that the Kingdom may be more and more the reality we all see.
